*New Zealand Times 08 Jul 1887 The Courts – A Youthful Housebreaker*

John William Lewis, a small boy, was charged with having feloniously broken into the dwelling-house of **Henry Fink** on the 4<sup>th</sup> inst., and stolen therefrom a silver watch, valued at £4 10s. The accused admitted the offence. The father of the accused stated that the boy had been rather troublesome, and he believed he was "a shingle short." His Worship ordered the accused to be imprisoned for one week, and then sent to the Industrial School until he should reach the age of 15 years, the father to contribute 4s a week toward his support.

*Sporting Life 26 Nov 1889 Pedestrianism*

A 100 yards match, for £5-a-side, took place on Saturday last, between Tom Steele, of Waltham Cross, and H. West, Enfield Highway. Steele has been on the warpath for the past thirty years, and has won several matches and handicaps, winning a 300 yards handicap at Hackney Wick as far back as 1859. West is, comparatively speaking, a novice, this being his first match for money. The race took place on the road near the Fallow Buck, Enfield. The men took the mark at half-past three and were despatched to an excellent start by Mr G. Foster, of Birmingham. The old 'un held a slight lead to eighty yards, when West forged ahead and won a grand race by a foot. Mr J. Butler, of Small Heath, was referee, and Mr H. Ellis stakeholder. The company, about 300, then adjourned to Mr **Bartholomew Fink's** well-known hostelry, the Fallow Buck, and spent a pleasant evening in harmony.

The wedding of Miss Alice Marguerite McDowall, of Maida Vale, England, to Mr Robert Webb Johnson, of Cricklewood, England, took place at Wesley Church, Petone, recently, when the Rev J. A. Lochore officiated. Miss Lochore presided at the organ. The bride was escorted by Mr H. Topham, and wore a frock of pink georgette, her embroidered veil being held in place by a coronet of orange blossom. Her bouquet was of white roses, Christmas lilies, and maidenhair fern. The bridesmaids were Misses Margaret Topham and Veronica Kerins, the former wearing powder blue crepe de chine, and the latter cyclamen, each having a large hat to tone with her frock. Mr C. Topham and Mr R. McDowall were best man and groomsman respectively. The wedding reception was held at the Regal, and later the bride and bridegroom left for Rotorua and Auckland.
