The death occurred at the residence of her son, Mr S. Walden, Latrobe, last night of Mrs Emma Walkden, relict of the late James Walkden. Deceased had not enjoyed good health for over two years past, so that her demise was not unexpected. With her husband and family of four sons and two daughters, she came out to Tasmania from England 36 years ago, landing at Launceston, and subsequently residing successively at Westbury, Launceston, and Frankford. About 14 years ago, on the death of Mr Walkden, she came to reside at Latrobe. Mrs Walkden was born at Manchester, England, 77 years ago. Messrs S. Walkden (Latrobe), and T. Walkden (Frankford) are sons, the other members of the family being married and settled on the mainland. The remains will leave Latrobe by tomorrow morning's train for Westbury, where they will be interned alongside those of her husband in the Church of England Cemetery.
