The Argus (Melbourne, Victoria, Australia) 13 Sep 1927 Charge of Bribery

Builder and Council Officer. Thomas Norman Jenkins, builder, Sandown road, Flemington, was charged at the Brunswick Court on Monday, before Mr P. J. Conlon, P.M., with having unlawfully and corruptly offered to give to John Francis Hallian, an officer of the Brunswick Council, a bribe of money, to wit £2 2s for Hallian to desist from proceeding against Jenkins under a prosecution of the building by-laws of the City of Brunswick. The prosecution was conducted by Mr J. B. Eggleston, on behalf of the Brunswick Council. John Francis Hallian, building inspector to the Brunswick Council, said:- On September 1 I visited a house in course of erection by Jenkins in Manica street, West Brunswick, and looked at certain work which I had ordered to be done. I found that the order had not been complied with, and I told Jenkins that I would prosecute him. Jenkins said:- "I am a good Salvation Army man, and it would break my wife's heart if you prosecute me. Two guineas in your pocket is better than prosecuting me." I said:- "Put your building in order," and walked out. Next day Constable Wise accompanied me to Manica street in my motor-car. I went into the house, and then came out with Jenkins. I said I would have to prosecute Jenkins adding "I gave you a fair go, but you did not fix the concrete correctly." I asked Jenkins if he had not offered me £2 2s on a previous day to forego prosecutions. He said he had. Constable Wise then jumped out of the car accused Jenkins of having offered me a bribe to forgo my duty. Jenkins said that it was only a tip. Constable E. G. Wise said:- I heard Hallian say to Jenkins:- "I will have to prosecute you." He asked Jenkins what he had offered to give Hallian if he would not prosecute him. Jenkins replied £2 2s." I got out of the car and took possession of the money. Jenkins was committed for trial at the General Sessions on October 3. Bail was fixed at £50, with the accused in a like amount.

The Argus 6 Oct 1827 Bribery Charge Fails – Builder Found Not Guilty

Thomas Norman Jenkins, builder of Sandown road, Flemington, was charged before Judge Winneke in General Sessions yesterday with having attempted to bribe John Francis Hallian, an officer of the Brunswick City Council. Mr Magennis (instructed by Messrs Johnson, Johnson and Davies) appeared for Jenkins. Mr Sproule, Crown prosecutor, conducted the prosecution. In evidence, Hallian said:- On September 1 Jenkins had not carried out my instructions to make larger holes for the studs under the floor joists of a house which he was erecting. He had only 'camouflaged' the studs, and I told him that I would prosecute him. According to the regulations the studs should go down 18 inches. Jenkins said:- "I am a good Salvation Army man and it would break my wife's heart if you prosecute me. Two guineas in your pocket is better than prosecuting me." I told him to put the studs right. Next day Constable Wise secreted himself in the back of my car. The constable saw Jenkins produce the money, and heard him repeat the offer to me. Cross examined by Mr Magennis, Hallian said that he had been a building inspector for the Brunswick City Council for three years. He had been offered bribes before, but this was his first prosecution. In other instances he had not been able to establish a case. Jenkins, in evidence, said:- I put in extra studs, and also a depth of six inches of concrete. When Hallian came again he said that he would have to prosecute, but after I urged him not to adopt this course he told me that I might put in brick piers. As he was leaving I asked him to accept two guineas. Hallian replied "Go on with your job" At this time the inspector had allowed me to make the alterations, and I did not offer him the money to induce him to forego his duty. On the following day I again asked the inspector if he would take the money. He asked me to come over to the car. I did so, and offered him the money. Then the constable jumped out. The jury returned a verdict of not guilty. Jenkins was discharged.
