All and whole that plot of ground in the lands of Galvebeg, with the two storey house, &c., built thereon, measuring 10 Falls, 7 Ells, or thereby, and bounded on the North and West by lands belonging to Anthony Murray, Esquire, of Crieff and Dollerie, on the South by the High Road leading from Crieff to Perth, and on the East by a Lane, the property of George Millar, the Few extending to the distance of nine inches from the East Gable of the said Dwelling-house. ### *Perthshire Courier 26 May 1836 Notice to the Creditors of John McKiech, Grocer, Crieff*

The said John McKiech having executed a Trust Conveyance for behoof of his Creditors, the Trustees hereby intimate, that a meeting of the creditors will be held in the house of Mr McIlvrde, Vintner, Crieff, on the 25<sup>th</sup> of June next, at noon, for the purposes of the Trust; and hereby request of the Creditors to lodge their Claims, with oaths of verity thereto, on or before the above day, with the said Mr McIlvrde, one of the Trustees, or Messrs Steven & Brown, Writers, Crieff, certifying to those who fail to do so, that they will be excluded from any share in the after division of the Funds. *Perthshire Courier 15 Sep 1836 Crieff*

On the 4<sup>th</sup> instant, while Mr Robert McIlvrde and family were at church, a sum of money, consisting of nearly £30, was abstracted from a drawer in one of the rooms, where it had been deposited the previous evening. From several circumstances which occurred on Monday, suspicions alighted on a boy, about 14 or 15 years of age, in the employment of Mr McIlvrde, who, upon being questioned, protested that he was innocent, and denied all knowledge of it. Their suspicions were, however, strengthened by the boy's immediate absconding. Several persons set out in search of him, when he was apprehended about a mile north from Ardoch, and taken back to Crieff. After being examined by Mr Gowans, writer, he was sent off, on Tuesday morning, to Perth jail. On being apprehended, he confessed he had stolen the money, and opened the place where it was laid by means of some old keys, which he found about the kitchen, and said that he had concealed the money in one of Mr McIlvrde's stables, which proved to be true; as, on being taken to the place, he brought out £23 9s 6d, the balance having been squandered away in the early part of the day. The boy is said to belong to Perth. On representing himself as an orphan, in destitute circumstances, he was taken in by Mr McIlvrde about six months ago, and kindly used merely through sympathy for his situation.

A composition may be offered at this latter meeting; and to entitle creditors to the first dividend, their oaths and grounds of debt must be lodged on or before the 1<sup>st</sup> February 1843.
