

George Edwin MEWIS (1825-1907)

British Army Service Record – Reference WO 97 / 93 / 89

George Edwin Mewis born Edgbaston, Birmingham, Warwickshire. Private 16th (Queen's Lancers).

The Board having examined and compared the Regimental Records, the Soldier's Book, and such other Documents as appeared to them to be necessary, report that George Edwin Mewis by Trade a clerk was born in the Parish of Edgbaston in or near the Town of Birmingham in the County of Warwick and was attested for the 14th Regiment of Light Dragoons at London in the County of Middlesex on the 21 Sept 1842 at the Age of 18 years 6 months that after making every Deduction required by Her Majesty's Regulations, the Service up to this day, which he is entitled to reckon, amounts to 3 years, 182 days, as shewn by the detailed Statement on the 2nd page; during all which period he served at home and further, that his discharge is proposed in consequence of his being found unfit for further service. With regard to character and conduct George Edwin Mewis the Board have to report, that upon reference to the Defaulter's Book, and by the Parole testimony that has been given, it appears they are good.

George Edwin Mewis being asked to what date he has been paid, answered that his Account is balanced up to the latest period required by the Regulations; and being further asked whether he has any claim on the Regiment for Arrears of Pay, Allowances, or Clothing, answered that he has received all just demands, from his entry into the Service up to the 21 March 1846 and in confirmation therefore, affixes his signature hereto.

Detailed Statement of the Services of George Edwin Mewis.

14th Light Dragoons, Rank Private, from 21 Sep 1842 to 31 Oct 1842, a period of 41 days

16th Lancers, Rank Private, from 1 Nov 1842 to 21 Mar 1846, a period of 3 years and 141 days

And further service from 22 May 1846 to 23 Jun 1846, a period of 33 days

Total service 3 years 215 days

Medical Report... Private George Edwin Mewis, 16 Lancers... This is a case of more or less permanent weakness of right knee, the consequence of inflammation, with frequent relapse upon exertion – originally caused, he states, by a kick from a horse while on detached duty at Canterbury about 2½ years since – Being a young soldier, scarcely more than three years in the service and who has been very inefficient for two years and a half; the prospect of future usefulness as a Dragoon is very doubtful and he has therefore been proposed for discharge from the Service.

Physical Description: Height - 5 feet 7 ¾ inches; Hair - Brown; Eyes - Grey; Complexion - Fresh; Trade - Clerk.
