A great loss was sustained by the Lower Hutt Borough in the sudden death of Mr John Joseph Doran last Wednesday afternoon. Mr Doran, who was the Deputy Superintendent of the local Volunteer Fire Brigade, was a member of the firm of Messrs Taylor, Ramsey and Co., plumbers, of Wellington, and left home on Wednesday morning for his business in his usual state of health, but became indisposed and was removed to his home where he died soon after arrival. The deceased was born at Owaka in 1876 and came to Lower Hutt some 40 years ago, joining the firm of which he afterwards became part proprietor. Mr Doran lived a life of service in a quiet and unostentatious manner. For 20 years he took a very active interest in the formation of the 1<sup>st</sup> Lower Hutt Boy Scouts and joined the Lower Hutt Volunteer Fire Brigade 31 years ago, holding the gold star for 25 years' service. As secretary for the Brigade, he took a particularly keen interest in fire brigade matters and commanded the highest love and respect from all with whom he came in contact. He was untiring in the cause he served and his loss will be a serious blow to his many friends. The late Mr Doran was a member of the Foresters' Lodge, Court Bloomfield. He is survived by his widow, three sons, Messrs A. J., A. E., and H. V. Doran, and two daughters, Mesdames Doyle and Henderson, all of Lower Hutt. The deceased was accorded a fireman's funeral with full honours. The bearers were Foreman L. Doran, Assistant Foreman, H. Wilson, Firemen T. Slinn, W. Mullany, N. Francis and R. Bartley, all of the local brigade. At the mortuary chapel the service was conducted by the Rev H. Peat and the Chief Ranger of the Foresters, Bro. J. Ashforth, recited the Lodge ritual. At the graveside the Fire Brigades' special ritual was recited by Fireman T. Slinn and the Rev H. Peat paid a verbal tribute to the deceased's life of service. The casket was borne on one of the brigade's fire engines which also carried a large number of beautiful floral tributes and the deceased's helmet and axe. Immediately following were fire engines from Lower Hutt, Wellington, Petone, Upper Hutt. Other brigades represented were Eastbourne, Carterton, Silverstream, Featherston, who formed a guard of honour with the local brigade. Among those present were Deputy Super. Creeke (Wellington), Deputy Supt. Hartley (New Plymouth), Super. T. Flinn, (Lower Hutt), Deputy Super. A. Burrows (Petone), Bro. Sanvig (District C.O., A.O.F.), Bro. E. E. Stoupe (District Treasurer and District Trustee, A.O.F.), the Mayor, Mr J. W. Andrews, Crs M. Macaskill, R. M. Russell, P. Dowse, W. F. Hall, Messrs R. F. Mainland, W. T. Strand, B. S. Knox, H. Horman, A. Grierson, Sergt. McHolm. The 1<sup>st</sup> Boy Scouts were represented by Messrs J. McConville, F. L. McKenzie, V. Keats and J. P. Hislop. The firemen wore draped decorations. The scene was a most impressive one as the long cortege left the chapel for the Taita Cemetery preceded by the Lower Hutt Civic Band, under Bandmaster R. G. Ward, playing the beautiful funeral march, "The Garland of Flowers." At the V.I.C. the Band was picked up and conveyed to the end of Cemetery Road where it again led the cortege to the cemetery.

Mayor's Tribute

Speaking of the great loss the district had sustained in the death of Mr Doran, the Mayor, Mr J. W. Andrews, said: The late John Joseph Doran rendered service to the citizens of Lower Hutt that cannot be defined in any words that I could utter. For 31 years he had been a member of the Volunteer Fire Brigade and for the past 21 years he had held the high office of Deputy Superintendent. His sudden demise removes from our midst a very efficient, self-sacrificing officer, who did the job that he was so well fitted for, with an enthusiasm and devotion that was an inspiration to all his comrades. His service to his fellow men over such a lengthy period was a very great one. A kindly husband, a loving and understanding father, an efficient and a very popular fire brigade officer, and a citizen of whom all are proud, has gone to his reward.

A well-known figure in lodge circles in the Hutt Valley was removed by the death today of Mr Job Leadbeater, in his eighty-second year. Born on January 30, 1857, in Coventry, England, and educated at Bollake School, Mr Leadbeater arrived at Wellington on January 22, 1875, and worked for six months in the Lion Foundry. He then walked from Ashburton to Dunedin, where he found employment in a foundry. He left at the end of 1877 for the Kumara goldfields. Later, he returned to Wellington, and was re-engaged at the Lion Foundry. In 1883 Mr Leadbeater and his wife took up residence in Petone, and Mr Leadbeater started work in the railway workshops, where he remained until the end of January, 1917. Mr Leadbeater joined Court Pride of Dunedin, Ancient Order of Foresters, on January 25, 1876, and was put into office as junior beadle on the night of his initiation. On his return to Wellington in 1878 he joined Court Sir George Grey, 3118, A.O.F., by clearance, and held several offices in that court. Court Epuni, 7314, was opened by a torchlight procession through Petone on May 28, 1886. Mr Leadbeater was elected court secretary, and held office for 47 years until his retirement. He opened the juvenile court in October, 1886. He also went to Lower Hutt and gathered the names of members and opened Court Bloomfield himself in 1891. He opened Court Primrose for women in 1892. He went through the chairs of the district executive in 1891 and received the honour of P.D.C.R. that year. Mrs Leadbeater died on February 5. The family consists of Messrs Len Leadbeater (Pokeno) and Job Leadbeater (Tauranga) and Mesdames M. Barker (Wellington), H. L. Miles (Waihi), D. Petherick (Petone), and W. A. Petersen (Petone).
