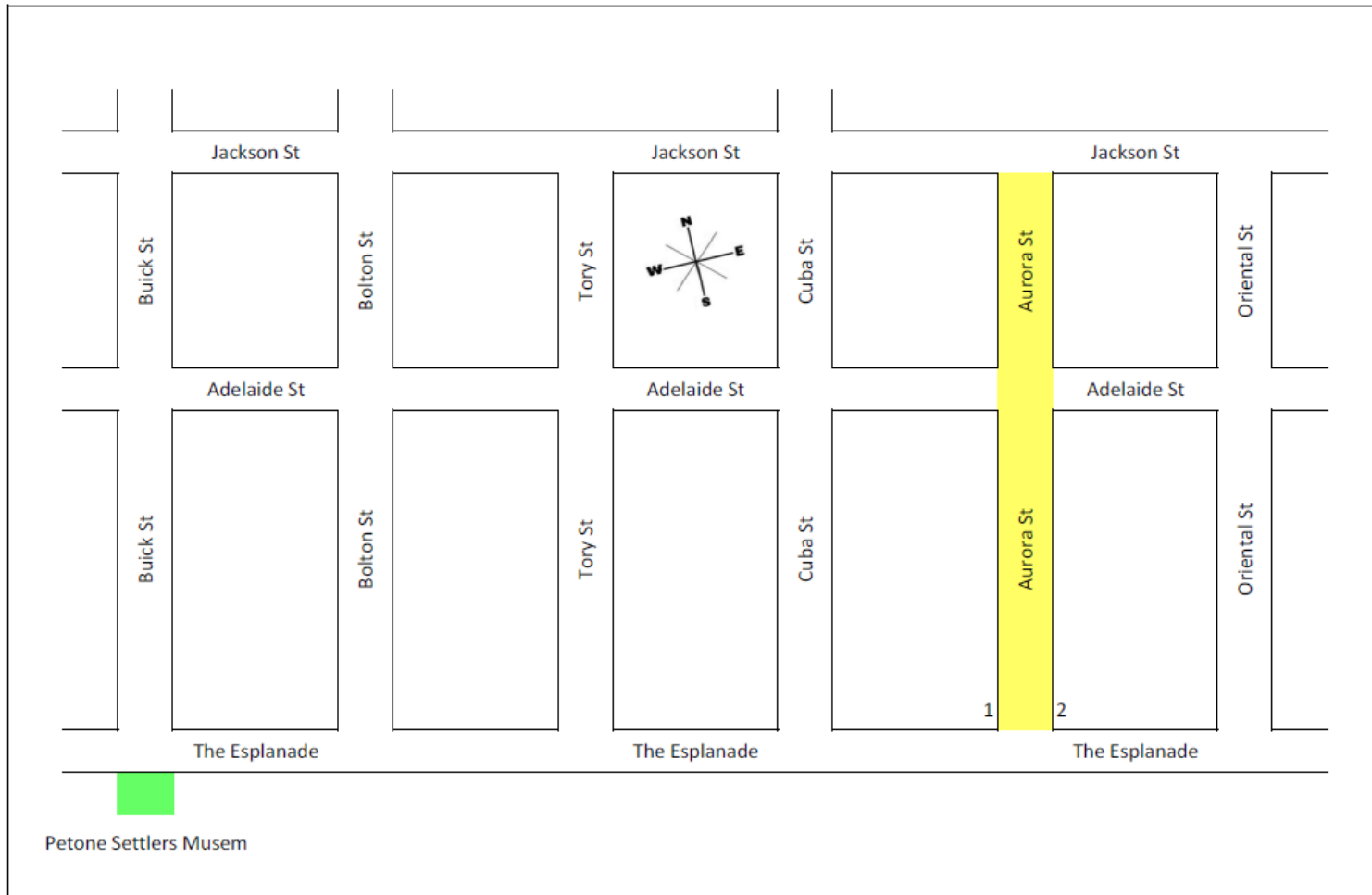


Aurora Street, Petone



Petone – A History by Susan Butterworth p69

Captain Mein Smith's 1840 survey had divided Petone into ten sections of roughly a hundred acres each, in keeping with the policy on country sections. They numbered from No.1 at the Korokoro end to 10 at Gear Island. Numbers 1, 2 and 3 were Maori reserves encompassing the village and its cultivations, including part of the hillside at Korokoro. In 1843 the owners of the others were: No.4, J. C. Bidwill; 5, R. Hanson and C. von Alzdorf; 6, F. A. Molesworth; 7 and 8, Colonel Wakefield; 9, Henry St Hill; and 10, C. von Alzdorf... Colonel Wakefield tried to sell off and subdivide Section 7 as forty-nine quarter-acre allotments as early as October 1841. They were proposed as the site for a village, no doubt in emulation of adjacent Aglionby village, which was just then being formed. Presumably there were no takers, since the land was still in his possession in 1843. Residents of Petone were thus all leaseholders at this point, mostly eking out a subsistence with a cow or two, a few hens and vegetables, and a little fishing.

Daily Southern Cross 04 Apr 1854

A grand Founder's Festival took place at Petone on the 28th February. Three hundred persons – of whom seventy were natives – were present on the occasion.

The sections front the Esplanade, Tory, Cuba, Aurora, Oriental and Adelaide streets, which are to be formed by Mr Buick to the approval of the Petone Town Board. The terms offered to buyers are certainly liberal, viz., the payment of the purchase money is extended over a period of 10 years by equal yearly instalments.

Evening Post 08 Sep 1888

Messrs T. Kennedy Macdonald and Co. report that during the past week there has been a considerable demand for suburban and other property, as evidenced by the sales completed. Sixteen sections at Petone, facing Tory, Cuba, Aurora, Oriental and Adelaide-streets and the Esplanade, were sold at £20 each.

Evening Post 25 Jun 1904

The Petone Chamber of Commerce is desirous of erecting some memorial on the spot where the first settlers landed on Petone Beach. The matter was again before the Chamber last night, and it appeared to be agreed that the spot lay between Tory and Aurora streets. Mr Udy, one of those present at the meeting, was on one of the first three ships, and his memory bore out this belief. He, however, undertook to interview Mr Samuel Smith, of Blackridge, and Mr James Knight, of the Hutt, who were also among those who landed on that historical occasion. The settlement at Petone originally proposed, but subsequently abandoned, was shown on a plan produced at the meeting last night by Mr Morrison.

Evening Post 07 Feb 1910 Accidents and Fatalities – Fainted while bathing

Whilst bathing off the Petone beach on Sunday morning, a married woman named Elizabeth Mullis, suddenly collapsed, and had it not been for the presence of a party who happened to be passing at the time, the mishap would have ended seriously. The lady who was rescued in a fainting condition, was attended by Dr Ross, who ordered her removal to her home in Aurora street. Latest inquiries show that Mrs Mullis is progressing favourably.

Dominion 01 Jan 1915

On Wednesday Mrs Jane Jamieson, of Petone, died at the age of 78 years. Mrs Jamieson was married in 1861, and arrived with her husband at Lyttelton in 1865. After residing at Hokitika for over 20 years, they took up a farm at Torokiwi, and later removed to Petone. Both Mr and Mrs Jamieson were highly esteemed, and great sympathy will be extended to the husband in his bereavement. There are four sons and four daughters: George of Waipukurau; Robert of Cape Runaway; Andrew of Otaki; and John P. of Petone; and Mesdames Boden and Wade, Petone; Mrs Arnold, Brooklyn; and Mrs Newton of Tauranga. The funeral will take place from Aurora Street, Petone, for Karori, to-day.

Dominion 18 Jan 1915 Hutt and Petone News

The Petone Police are determined to put a stop to a practice that has been indulged in recently by some youths, which consists of playing cricket and other pastimes in certain streets on Sundays. Complaints have been made by Aurora Street residents of cricket balls having been hit on to their roofs, and in some instances boys have even climbed on to housetops to dislodge a ball that had got jammed.

Evening Post 19 Nov 1917

Some Petone residents had their milk supply somewhat curtailed on Sunday morning through an accident to a milk delivery cart. The horse and cart were standing in Cuba-street North, when the animal was startled, and broke away, careering round a number of streets. Finally the cart was brought to a standstill through a collision with a lamp post – which was completely wrecked – at the corner of Jackson and Aurora streets. The cart was considerably damaged, and milk cans were strewn far and wide along the streets. In the collision with the post the horse broke away, and galloped furiously down Jackson street with traces and swingletree dangling behind, and urging it forward. A little child in its pathway had a somewhat narrow escape from injury.

Evening Post 27 Sep 1928 Motor-cyclist killed – Collision with bus

A young man, Geoffrey Charles Phillips, aged about 20, was fatally injured at Petone just before 8 o'clock this morning. He was riding a motor-cyle along Jackson street, and when he reached the intersection of William and Jackson streets he collided with a bus. The bus had turned into William street and the motor-cycle came from behind a lorry and crashed into the bus as it was standing at the corner. Phillips suffered a compound fracture of the left leg, and his left foot and toes, the fingers of his left hand, and his skull were also fractured. After receiving some medical attention the injured man was taken to the Hospital by the City Ambulance. He was admitted to the Hospital at 9.30 and died at 10.40. The deceased was employed at the new railway workshops at Petone. He lived in Aurora street, Petone, but formerly resided at 9 Mulgrave street. An inquest will be held.

Evening Post 05 Jan 1945 Destroyed by Fire

A two-storey wooden building at the corner of the Esplanade and Aurora Street, Petone, owned by Mrs R. Cameron, Silverstream, and occupied by Messrs Young Bros., asbestos and lagging contractors, was totally destroyed by fire last night. The alarm was given at 11.35 o'clock, but, when the Petone Fire Brigade arrived, the whole premises were ablaze, with flames pouring from the roof and windows. The Lower Hutt Brigade responded to a call, and both brigades did excellent service in preventing the fire spreading to adjoining premises. It is understood that there was a small insurance on the building, which was an old one, but no particulars are yet available in regard to insurance on the contents. The cause of the fire has not been ascertained.

On November 29, 1936, accidentally killed on Pipe Bridge, Lower Hutt, Robert Kennedy, beloved husband of Margaret Ritchie, of 1 Aurora Street, Petone; aged 41. A heavy southerly wind caused a fatal accident of an exceptional kind on the Hutt Pipe Bridge about 9 o'clock this morning, the victim being Robert Ritchie, an employee at the Railway Workshops. A lorry owned by Barton Ginger and Company, Ltd., loaded with two full motor-car cases, was crossing the bridge when it was struck by a heavy gust of wind, and both the cases were blown off the vehicle. Mr Ritchie was caught by one of the cases, and his head was crushed by it, causing instant death. The victim of the accident was a married man with one child, living at 1 Aurora Street, Petone.

1928 Evening Post Dec 24

The death by drowning on the Petone beach last Saturday of Rae Verna Saul, aged 2 years 3 months, a daughter of Mr and Mrs R. W. Saul, of 3 Aurora street, Petone, was the subject of an inquest at Petone this morning before the Coroner (Mr J. H. Salmon, S.M.) Evidence given by the mother of the deceased and her sister Joan, aged 7, showed that the child Rae was paddling in the shallow water with Joan at about 12.15 p.m. on Saturday, when she fell face downwards in the water. The children were alone on that part of the beach at the time. Joan lifted the deceased child and carried her home, and Dr Hutchison was called. Dr Hutchison stated that he had applied artificial respiration to the child for half an hour, without result. Death was due to drowning. The Coroner have a verdict in accordance with the evidence that the deceased was accidentally drowned on the Petone beach, no blame being attachable to anyone.

He took part in the campaign in Malaya and was among the last to be evacuated. During the campaign he had to abandon his plane three times owing to engine trouble, and on one occasion he came down in the sea. Another time he received a shrapnel wound in the arm while on the ground. He was one of the youngest New Zealanders in Singapore.

He did not think he was doing any harm so long as he kept up the payments. He had paid the £24 after he had sold the car to Mrs Henry. The accused was committed to the Supreme Court for sentence. Messrs A. Coles and J. Huggan, JPs, occupied the Bench, and the case for the police was conducted by Detective-Sergeant F. N. Robinson.
