I have had a great deal of trouble with Mrs Murray. I have paid £2 2s for passage, 6s 6d for a pair of shoes to her boy ½ a pair of hose he had neither. She left with me the inclosed pawn brokers tickets for the purpose of relieving and sending the articles per steamer but I could not think of doing so without authority the letter from you saying that the Company would advance £3 is left with me.
