Huntingdon, Bedford & Peterborough Gazette 08 Jun 1839 The Queen v. the Justices of Cambridge

On Tuesday in the Bail Court, Mr F. Kelly applied for a rule, calling upon the defendants to show cause why a *mandamus* should not issue requiring them to grant a warrant of distress to be levied on the goods of a person named Turner, for the non-payment of a church-rate of 9d. in the pound, made the 6th of December last by the churchwardens and overseers of the parish of St Clement, Cambridge. The defendants refused to grant the warrant of distress against Turner, without assigning any reason whatever to the church-wardens. – Rule granted.

Huntingdon, Bedford & Peterborough Gazette 22 Jun 1839 Church Rates – St Clement's Parish

To the Editor, - Sir. – In your paper of June 8, my name fills a conspicuous situation, as to certain proceedings in the Court of Queen's Bench. I confidently appeal to those gentlemen who have filled the office of Churchwarden previous to Mr Warren, that all such demands have hitherto been duly and cheerfully paid. Mr Warren, in this instance, was informed by me that I only objected because my neighbour, Mr Faulkner, had for years refused paying such demands. Mr Faulkner's reasons for objecting to pay Church-rates are notorious; why therefore, Mr W. did not select him, is a matter of surprise to myself and friends. I am totally unconscious of ever having given Mr Warren offence, or any unnecessary trouble in the discharge of his public duties; I therefore feel entitled to adopt this course to disabuse the public mind, as to any impression which may have been formed, in reference to the matter in question. From what has since transpired, it will appear evident that Mr Churchwarden Warren's zeal has exceeded the bounds of discretion as a public-officer, for he has stated, as the grounds for these proceedings, that he knew me to be a member of the "Church Rate Abolition Society." – Of the existence of some such society I am aware, but I deny his insinuations, as some little trouble on his part would have proved. Cambridge Chronicle and Journal 18 Jun 1859 Petty Sessions and Police Intelligence

Mr Henry Turner laid a complaint against George Turner, bricklayer, for assaulting him, and threatening that that was not all he might expect. The complainant said on Saturday evening he was taking his glass at the Crown, Newmarket-road, and the defendant was there also. The latter came up to him and asked him when he meant to pay the £5 witness owed him. He made no reply, and defendant punched him in the shoulder and the breast, and gave him to understand that that was not all he might expect. The defendant who was apparently a much younger and more vigorous man than the complainant, denied the statement of his relative. He was bound over to keep the peace for three months.
