Quite a gloom was cast over Temuka yesterday when it became known that Mr Philip Wareing, of "Fair View" farm, Milford, had passed away in his sleep on Thursday night, or in the early hours of yesterday morning. The deceased had not enjoyed good health for some few years past, suffering from an affection of the heart. A man of jovial disposition and of vigorous personality, he had a host of friends in both North and South Canterbury. When he first settled at Temuka it was as a draper, but after carrying on this business successfully for some few years, he leased about 500 acres of land and subsequently bought the same are in the Milford district. He was a very successful farmer, taking a special interest in stock. He took a great pride in his light horses and always kept one or two good ones even after he took to driving a motor car. With his horses he took many prizes in the show ring. He was an enthusiastic member of the Temuka A. and P. Association. A few years ago he sub-divided his farm and sold it, retaining the homestead and a small area where he has since resided in retirement. The deceased is survived by a widow and a large family of grown-up sons and daughters, some of the sons being settled on farms of their own in various parts of the district, while others are at the front.

It is with regret that we have to record the death of Mr Philip Wareing, of "Fairview," Milford, which occurred at an early hour yesterday morning. The late Mr Wareing was born at Harborne, Birmingham, England, being one of a family of ten children, and came out to New Zealand 41 years ago to join his brother Mr Joseph Waring, who then had the Temuka Stone Store, which was a large business concern in those days. The brothers carried on the store for a few years, and then about 1879 disposed of it to the late Mr John Miles, and engaged in farming at Milford, Temuka, and Rangitata. After seven years they dissolved partnership, but the late Mr Wareing continued farming until his death, although of late years his health has been very precarious. About six or seven years ago he had a serious illness, and although he recovered a fair measure of health, he was never very strong again. He seemed in much his usual health and was about till the last. Several of the members of the Trentham Band and bayonet party were billeted at his house, and he was at the railway station on Thursday to see them off and seemed to be thoroughly enjoying himself. He went to bed as usual on Thursday night, and passed away in his sleep early on Friday morning. The late Mr Wareing never took a prominent part in public affairs, but he was always ready to help in doing anything to forward the interests of the district. He was one of the original members of the Temuka and Geraldine Agricultural and Pastoral Association and was its president for several years after its resuscitation taking much interest in it. He was also a life member of the S. C. Acclimatisation Society and the Temuka F. and H. Society. He married before he came to New Zealand, and leaves a widow, six sons, and eight daughters to mourn their loss. He also leaves fifteen grandchildren. He was a good husband and a kind father, a man of strict integrity and most hospitable, and his death will be heard of with regret by a large circle of friends.

*Temuka Leader 10 Jul 1928 Obituary*

The death occurred at Timaru Hospital on Saturday, of Mr Joseph B. Wareing, a very old resident of Temuka. Deceased was born in Birmingham, England, in 1848, and came to Auckland in the ship *Surat*. He was then 16 years of age. For a time he was employed as a shepherd in the Mackenzie Country, and was subsequently engaged in storekeeping at Burke's Pass. He shortly afterwards removed to Temuka, where he engaged in the same class of business, and was for a short time an ironfounder in partnership with Mr K. F. Gray. His next venture was farming, his property, known as "Woodlands," being situated at Temuka, consisting of 75 acres of freehold (rich, drained swamp), 400 acres at Rangitata, and 200 acres of leasehold. Mr Wareing also bred Border Leicester sheep, and for a time did a profitable business in the sale of rams. Mr Wareing also loved a good horse, and among other noted equines which he possessed was "Lord Kitchener," which had an unbeaten record in the show-ring. He was exhibited from a yearling to eight years of age at all the principal shows between Christchurch and Dunedin, and never once suffered defeat. The deceased was for many years a member of the Timaru Agricultural and Pastoral Association. Though Mr Wareing did not take an active part in public affairs, he assisted greatly during his long career in advancing the general welfare of the district. It is interesting to note that he was a passenger on the ship *Bruce* when she was wrecked at Port Chalmers. He married Miss Hoare, daughter of the late Mr Patrick Hoare, one of Timaru's earliest settlers, and had eleven of a family – seven daughters and four sons. Four of the former and three of the latter survive. Mrs Wareing predeceased her husband a little over twelve months ago. The surviving daughters are: Mrs T. Brosnahan (Dunedin), Mrs J. Burke (Palmerston North), Mrs J. McKenzie (Auckland) and Mrs Harold Washington (Temuka). The three surviving sons Francis (Sydney), Cecil, who is a carrier in Wellington, and George, who is in the Railway service at Palmerston North. The deceased was laid to rest at the Temuka Cemetery yesterday, when a large number of relatives and friends attended. The following were the pall-bearers:- Messrs Harold L. Wareing (Temuka), Louis Wareing (Temuka), Ralph Wareing (Fairlie), and John Goodwin (Waitohi). The Rev Father Tymons officiated at the graveside.
