*York Herald 14 May 1808 To be sold by Auction*

For the benefit of the Creditors of Thomas Wood and George Wood, at the house of Robert Ascough, Innholder, in Kirkby Malzeard, on Wednesday the twenty-fifth day of May 1808 at six o'clock in the afternoon a freehold messuage with a shop, stable, garth, and garden, belonging thereto, situate in Kirkby Malzeard, near Ripon, and lately in the occupation of Thomas Wood the elder, and Ann Horner. Apply, for particulars, to Anthony Wood, of Street-house, in the Parish of Hornby, near Catterick; or to Mr Coates, at his Office, in Ripon. May 9, 1808.

Whereas a Commission of Bankrupt is awarded and issued forth against Thomas Wood and George Wood, both of Kirkby Malzeard, in the County of York, Butchers, Dealers, Chapmen, and Copartners in Trade, and they being declared Bankrupts, are hereby required to surrender themselves to the Commissioners in the said Commission named, or the major part of them, on the twenty-seventh and twenty-eighth days of February instant, at the House of Robert Ascough, the Queen's Head, in Kirkby Malzeard aforesaid; and on the twenty-fifth day of March next, at the House of Ann Arnett, the Black Swan, in Bedale, in the said County, at eleven o'clock in the Forenoon of each day, and make a full discovery and disclosure of the Estate and Effects; when and where the Creditors are to come prepared to prove their debts, and at the second sitting to choose Assignees, and at the last sitting the said Bankrupts are required to furnish their examination, and the Creditors are to assent to, or dissent from the allowance of their certificate. All persons indebted to the said Bankrupts, or that have any of their effects, are not to pay, or deliver the same but to whom the Commissioners shall appoint, but give notice to Mr Coates, of Ripon, in the County of York, Attorney at Law; or to Messrs Dodington and Hall, Secondaries' Office, Temple, London.
